Navami Tithi

Maa Siddhidaatri

Om Siddhidaatri Daivya Namah

On Navami Tithi of Navratra there is a tradition to worship Maa Sidhidaatri who endows ashtsidhis. Lord Shiva had achieved quite many sidhis as a fruition of all his prayers to Maa Bhagwati. Subsequently Maa Bhagwati had obtained half part of body resembling female and half part of body resembling male. For this reason Lord Shiva was popularly called Ardhnarishwar. Before initiating any prayer or auspicious work its advised by our ancient sages and seers that devotee must first worship Maa Siddhidaatri.

The Procedure to Worship:

Foremost place one wooden plank. Spread red cloth on it. On top of that place image of Maa Sidhi Daatri. Also keep Sidhi Daatri Yantra. Thereafter take red flowers in hand. Meditate on Maa Bhagwati and Chant mantra Om aing hring kling chamundayae vichchayae! Om Sidhidaatri Devayae Namah! On completing meditation offer red flowers on lotus feet of Maa Siddhi Daatri. Worship with panchopchar and shoda opchar. Light lamp of ghee. Offer Naivadaya. Chant twenty one thousand times Navarna Mantra. On completion of chanting mantra perform Yagya. Offer oblations in sacred fire called Poorna Ahuti. In the last invite all Brahmins at home. Offer them food, clothes and dakshina. Worship unmarried daughters and serve them meals. Gift them red color silk trappings (Dupatta). Because red duppatta is most loved by Maa Bhagwati. Young unmarried daughters are called manifestation of Maa Bhagwati. Thus on this day worship of girls is supposed to be most auspicious.

Offering to Maa Siddhidaatri will change your destiny

Today after bath worship Maa Bhagwati. Offer sweets prepared from rice paddy. Today any thing donated to poor and needy persons can shower all happiness of heaven to devotee.

Natives undergoing evil effects due to malefic effects of nine planets should worship Maa Siddhi Daatri. Also chant mantras Om aing hring kling chamundayae Vichchayae! Om Sidhidaatri Devayae Namah!
